PROCEEDINGS

Day One

Mr. Siba Prasad Sahu, Programmer Officer cordially welcomed all the participants on behalf of Centre for People's Forestry, followed by which there was self introduction by the participants. The first half of the day involved competitions for the partner NGOs of Orissa. It was aimed at breaking ice and creating better understanding. Informing the participants about the purpose of the competitions, Mr. Bruslin Mento, Programme Officer, CPF requested all to participate in the programme and observe the stipulated time for each competition strictly so as to complete them in time. The events were coordinated by Mr. Ashish, Programme Officer, Jharkhand. A total of 30 participants belonging to three Divisions viz. Keonjhar, Kandhamal and Nawarangpur were grouped into three teams. The events involved singing, elocution, laughter challenge, debate, drawing and skit. Each competition was judged by a jury involving three members from CPF staff, trustees, partner NGOs from Andhra Pradesh and Jharkhand as appropriate. The result of each item has been placed at the annexure.

Annual Day Function

The second session marked commemoration of CPF's Annual Day. Mr. Arun Kumar Bansal, Project Director, OFSDP, Dr. Gopal Tripathy, Joint Director, AHD, Mr. Sanjay Upadhyay, Trustee CPF and Dr. Kameswar Rao, Trustee, CPF were the special guests who made it to the event. Dr. D. Surya Kumari, Director, CPF requested and invited all dignitaries to the dais. The invitees were. Dr. Suryakumari requested Mr. Sanjay Upadhyay to chair the session. In his opening remarks Mr. Sanjay Upadhyay highlighted the success of CPF's six year working. He praised the team spirit of CPF. He appreciated the leadership quality of CPF's Director Dr. Suryakumari. During its six year existence it strengthened its work in Andhra Pradesh and started its work in Orissa and in Jharkhand. CPF excels especially in multi stakeholders approach and collaboration. It brings NGOs and GOs into one platform.

Mr. Mento thanked the dignitaries for their kind presence and patience in the programme.

Overview 2007 – 08

Mr. Sanjay Upadhyay requested to Dr.Suryakumari to present the programme overview of CPF. Dr. Suryakumari summarized and made a presentation on the overview of programmes for the year 2007 – 08. Mr. Upadhyay requested Finance Officer Mr. Y. Rajashekhar to make a presentation on the overview of budget of CPF. Mr. Rajashekhar presented budget and annual turnover of CPF for the year 2007 – 08.

Observations on CPF's work during the year

Mr. Kameswar Rao, trustee mentioned in his speech that the CPF is growing very rapidly and after 5th annual meet it expanded to Jharkahnd and Orissa. He praised the working approach of CPF. He told that the future of CPF is bright. He wished good wishes for future efforts of CPF. Mr. Sanjay Upadhyay mentioned in his speech that he associated with CPF for last five years. He appreciated and gave thank to CPF and

expressed that CPF believe in more action and less word. He pointed out major things that in every organization there is conflict within the team but in CPF it is counted as collective effort and each and every body is the part of the success. Finally he appreciated to Dr. Suryakumari for her strong effort, commitment, hard working and innovative initiative.

Ms. Pramila Panda of WORD, Keonjhar stated that CPF's intervention created a scope for NGOs to work collaboratively with government. It also created a platform to work collaboratively among the partners. Mr. Manoj of SAHARA, Nawarangpur opined that CPF's project enhanced the organizational growth. Due to CPF's intervention forest department came forward to work collaboratively with NGOs. It helped a good relationship between GO and NGO.

One NGO representative from Andhra Pradesh pointed out that CPF's approach and efforts helped working with government and made success of World Bank Project. Tribal people got more benefit from collaborative work of Forest Department and CPF. Mr. Trinad Rao of Coastal RRC mentioned that CPF's adda leaf project helped for socio-economic development of tribal people. The project empowered the tribal people.

Mr. Sanjay Patnaik of RCDC, Bhubaneswar opined that the main things influenced him that the transparent of CPF. The leadership of its Director marked a great change and CPF's growth. He wished a good luck to CPF in Orissa.

Messages by Guest

Dr. Gopal Tripathy, Joint Director, AHD expressed his feelings that in his lesser period of association he enjoyed a lot in CPF and also pointed that the efforts of CPF to solve fodder scarcity in Andhra Pradesh is really praiseworthy. It is a good sign that CPF has taken three divisions in Orissa for its intervention. He also informed that AHD has its own scheme to solve the fodder problem. He sought the cooperation from the NGOs in this regard. He informed that the Orissa Govt. has shown green signal to take care for fodder scarcity. He also informed that the AHD has taken initiative for gottery, poultry and animal husbandry. AHD also had taken initiative to provide good quality of goat, poultry and cattle.

Mr. Arun Kumar Bansal stated that he is delighted to involve in CPF's programme. He suggested to partners that organization need to be come forward to work with government for the betterment of community as there are many programmes of the government. He informed that under Orissa Forestry Sector Development Programme (OFSDP) the entire money will go to the account of the VSS and VSS members will decide how they will spent. Mr. Bansal said that he hopes for sustainability of VSS through OFSDP. He opined that VSS performance will be rating like success and failure. The cause of the success and failure should be documented. It will be lesson for others. He informed that under OFSDP fodder and herbal plantation are made in 623 VSS area.

He emphasized on the following points-

- Agro forestry model plan
- Need for forest resource assessment.
- Plantation of herbal and medicinal plant.

Mr. Sanjay Upadhyay suggested the following.

- Assessment of VSS
- Convergence of programmes at village level
- Initiative for Bio-diversity management.
- Facilitate for implementation of FRA

Conclusion and Vote of Thanks

At conclusion of the day Mr. Upadhyay gave best wishes to CPF and partner NGOs and mention that he hopes this knowledge and experience of this programme would give better livelihood for tribal group. At the end of the function Mr. Siba Prasad Sahu gave vote of thanks to all the dignitaries and participants.

Day Two

On the second day, Mr. Siba Prasad Sahu welcomed all the participants. He heartily welcomed and invited Mr. K. R. Singh, IFS, PD, WFP and Mission Director, State Bamboo Mission Authority to the dais. Mr. Singh, IFS, informed that earlier he was dealing World Food Programme of Govt. of India. This programme was looking for micro programme in village level, development of forest and development of infrastructure in the village distributing food grain and contributing labour. With a participatory way he started the presentation and highlighted the uses of Bamboo. He said that Orissa has heavy resources but it is not being used. It is require developing the population of bamboo. The price of per bamboo is Rs. 20-30 in the local market whereas a farmer can earn 20,000 to 30,000 rupees per acre in a year. If we make aware the people in this regard then people must be convinced and can earn and gather profits. He cited the example of Baripada district where the people have been cultivating Bamboo for last 100 years but they unable to get the accurate market price and day by day they are being cheated by traders. Again he mentioned the case study of a person who belongs to Baripada and earning 15 lakh rupees per annum. In Orissa market Sundakani and Badi Bausa are the fittest Bamboo from which a farmer can earn more and more. A farmer can produce 20-25 ton per hector if he can practice and utilize the proper guidance. One participant asked a question that to whom we could contact for plantation of Bamboo. Responding to participant Mr. Singh answered that Bamboo mission has been constituted in every district level. District magistrate is the chairperson and DFO is the member secretary of the district committee and they can suggest and provide much more information to cultivate the bamboo in a better way. Mr. Singh pointed out the following planning of Bamboo Mission -

- Planning marketing process
- Set up more value edition
- Livelihood resources
- Set up craft sector

Answering to one participant he said that income depends on how people can market and using marketing strategies. In most of the cases middle person takes the optimum benefit and the farmer gets less profit. In order to get optimum benefits the farmer has to find out the real market. In Orissa context the production of bamboo per annum is one lakh thirty thousand metric tones and in one locality one piece bamboo is sold by only Rs.100/-. If any farmer is keenly interested to cultivate them then the mission can provide support as per the provision of mission that is four hector for one farmer.

Speaking about the involvement of NGOs with respect to the bamboo plantation, they are planning to provide some administrative expenses to NGOs and they could mobilize and sensitize the people for plantation of bamboo. For the better understanding of participants he informed that NGOs should contact with district committee where District Magistrate cum Collector is the chair person and DFO is the member Secretary of District Committee.

At last Mr. Sahu gave thanks to Mr. Singh for his elaborate presentation and information about the National Bamboo Mission.

Discussion on Action Plan

Dr. Suryakumari appreciated the quarterly report from April to June 08 of nodal NGOs and opined that the quarterly report is very informative. But now CPF has already developed a format to understand the better outcome of partners and it was demonstrated and requested to follow it up, which could be really useful to go ahead. Dr. Suryakumari suggested that the partners have fill up the format and send to CPF about the progress of the outcomes. She informed that CPF is working on NREGA and FRA in both Andhra Pradesh and Orissa. She said in order to meet the eight outcome of the CPF programme, she declared the name of the responsible person and all the programme officers must be responsible for it. And after consolidating eight outcomes report will be sent to Orissa and Hyderabad office. Mr. Manish asked the partners regarding baseline survey for NREGA and when CPF do expect to get report. Partners will submit their report on NREGA by the end of September 2008. Mr. Manish demonstrated the questionnaire for CPF study status of NREGS in Orissa. The factual data on NREGA is available in the Block Office for which, why should we collect data from door to door. Adding to this Mr. Suresh said that the present problems in household will come out, if we use the given questionnaire. On the matter of given questionnaire there were few queries. In order to resolve the queries Dr.Suryakumari suggested that we are taking 10% sample from every village and there are few villages where total household is less than 40. So we can take minimum 5 household using stratified random sampling.

Mr. Biswamohan of ORRISSA said they may not be agreed to give exact sensitive data. So at first there is need of Focus Group Discussion. Responding to the question Mr. Manish mentioned we shall carry out survey after that we can ask the community for

some serious question and then we can facilitate for FGD. Mr. Suresh suggested that the number of survey would be followed up by 3 Nodal NGOs, then we will clarify and take strategy. Participants of the 3 divisions divided into 3 groups and discuss on action plan for the next 3 months. After a healthy discussion among them the action plan was prepared.

Action plan for August 2008 –March 2009

Nabrangpur

- ❖ Micro plan for 15 villages will be completed within January 2009\
- ❖ Micro planning staff training on August 2008
- ❖ Compilation of micro plan of the division will be completed within 31st March 2009
- ❖ NREGA within 3 months from date of supply of forms, 10%sample survey will be completed
- ❖ NREGA linkage to folder cultivation the process will start from September.
- ❖ FRA: 1000 individual forms and 5 to 10 community claim will be submitted within January 2009
- ❖ Gender equality and equality will be maintained in all 35 villages by 31st March 2008
- ❖ By September 15, 2008, HIV/AIDS workshop will be completed in all 7 clusters (35villages)
- ❖ NTFP innovation Project will be planned within December 2008
- ❖ VSS Performance study, according to the date of CPF, it will started
- ❖ Baseline survey of new villages will be completed within September 2008.
- ❖ Other linkage ill be continued.
- ❖ Monthly action plan, quarterly action plan, monthly review meeting on the 2nd of every month and action plan will be done accordingly.

After the presentation of action plan of three divisions, Mr. Suresh said that by 3rd week of September 2008 VSS meeting will be held. For data collection they will inform to nodal and it would be circulated to partners. By first week of September 2008 if you collect NREGA status and baseline data then it will be convenient to CPF for analyzing the data by 1st week of October. Informing to participants, Mr. Manish stated that you fill up the questionnaire of 2 villages as pre-testing and send it to CPF. After that new points would be incorporated in the questionnaire. Dr. Suryakumari requested all Nodal chief functionaries to watch /observe to organizer when they are collecting NREGA data then they can modify. Dr Suryakumari announced that as per the outstanding performance of partner CPF is planning to award the partners. CPF need suggestions of partners on this. The partners agreed with the proposal of Dr. Suryakumari. At last CPF awarded to the winners Rangoli and champions trophy. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd of the Rangoli competition were SAHARA, WORD and ORRISSA respectively. The champions trophy

gone to Nabarangpur and 1st runners up was Keonjhar and 2nd runners up was Kandhmal.

Some of the participants expressed their gratitude at the end of programme. It was a great opportunity for them to attend such meeting and to interact with the CPF personnel. And some added it was a wonderful opportunity and big experience.

Suggestions / feedback

It was suggested by the participants of Kandhamal that participants of 3 states should participate in the competitions. The suggestion also came that the programme should be one day and VSS leaders should be invited. To counter on this one participant from Jharkhand said that it should be two day. One day will not be enough. The participants suggested the competition is good practice and it should be continued.

It was felt by a participants of Jharkhand that programme needs to consist such as

- Field Exposure.
- Interaction with the forest officials of 3 states

This was a very good opportunity for strengthening the VSS and sensitize to forest department official and community. Every participant paid their gratitude to CPF.

Mr. Sib Prasad Sahu gave vote of thanks and programme came to end.
